

EMERGENCY CARD

The emergency card is a personal and nominative card containing the main health information related to the patient's rare disease.

It is specific to a given rare disease and allows for appropriate management and treatment to be provided during emergency care. Patients should keep their emergency card with them at all times to ensure that anyone providing care for them has all the information and recommendations required for an emergency situation.

This card has been filled in by the doctor responsible for the patient's care and follow-up.

ISOLATED OLLIER DISEASE - MAFFUCCI SYNDROME MULTIPLE ENCHONDROMATOSIS

POSSIBLE MANIFESTATIONS OF THE DISEASE

Presence of multiple enchondromas (cartilaginous tumors that develop within the bones) with an asymmetrical distribution

In the case of Maffucci syndrome : association with soft tissue hemangiomas :

Painful swelling of the fingers or feet

Limitation in joint mobility

Bone deformities and pain

COMPLICATIONS

Shortening of a limb, resulting in a limp

Fractures

Risk of malignant transformations of **chondromas**

Extraosseous manifestations

Ovarian tumors

Gliomas

EMERGENCY RECOMMENDATIONS

Standard management of a fracture

- Immobilization, analgesics
- Rapidly seek advice from the reference/competence center managing the patient's care and follow-up before considering orthopedic surgical treatment

Unusual and severe pain at the site of a chondroma

- Quickly consult the primary surgeon

In case of headache, nausea, seizures, diplopia

- Brain imaging (glioma?)
- Rapidly seek advice from the reference/ competence center managing the patient's care and follow-up
